This year marked IMPACT's 3rd annual Scientific Conference on embedded Pragmatic Clinical Trials (ePCTs). The goal of the event is to disseminate knowledge, promote research development, and engage partners to improve the care and health outcomes of people living with dementia (PLWD) and their care partners. The conference provides an interactive forum for participants to present research and discuss emerging insights to improve dementia care.

This is an informational and interactive eLearning module designed for primary care teams to increase their knowledge and skills related to ADRD. The module discusses risk factors for ADRD, risk reduction strategies, evidence-based practices for culturally sensitive ADRD care, identifying a care partner, and using a team approach to ADRD care.

New Book Publication


Population Science Methods and Approaches to Aging and Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias Research
