The Cognition in Primary Care Program website provides [resources](#) to increase support for patients and their care partners, as well as [clinical tools](#) to help PCPs compassionately counsel about a new diagnosis. When patients come into the clinic, simple checklists embedded into the electronic health record (EHR) serve as a backbone for tracking and facilitating this model of wraparound care. It was a pleasure connecting with you all at the DSC Summit in Washington, D.C. last month!




