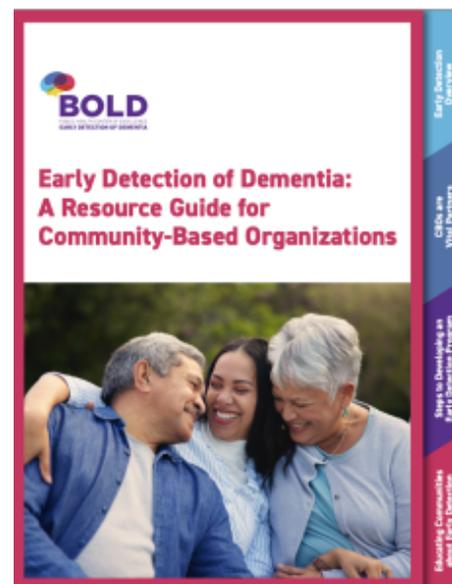
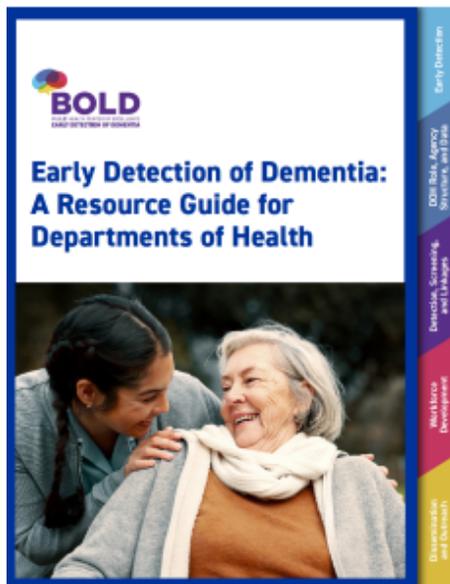

New Three-PHCOE Collaborative Manuscript: "Community health workers: developing roles in public health dementia efforts in the United States"

This summer, the three BOLD Public Health Centers of Excellence published a manuscript, ***Community health workers: developing roles in public health dementia efforts in the United States!*** This manuscript outlines how Community Health Workers (CHWs) can strengthen the public health response to dementia. CHWs play an important role in addressing chronic diseases. These skills apply equally to brain health: CHWs can promote risk reduction, encourage early detection, and help individuals and caregivers navigate care services and systems.

Published in *Frontiers in Public Health*, the article describes how CHWs are well-positioned to bridge public health, clinical care, and community-based services, especially in communities with elevated dementia risk.

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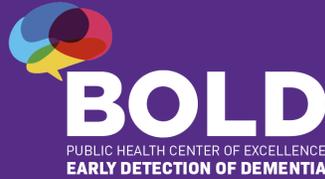
